Youngsters are invited to "join up" and practice the drills that soldiers learn in their regiments.

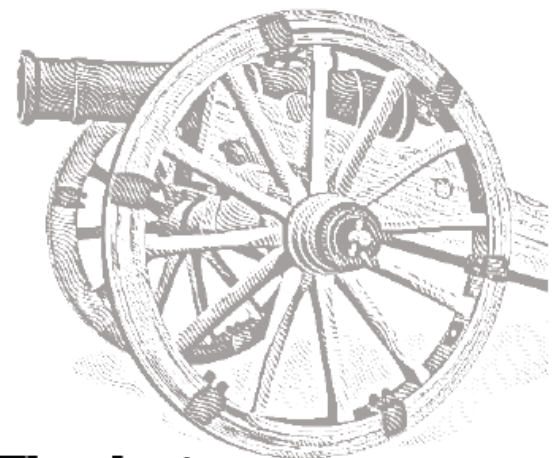
